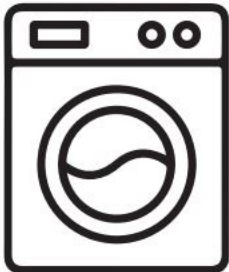

Soap nuts are soap berry shells from the *Sapindus mukorossi* tree native to the foothills of the Himalayas. Used in Nepal and India for centuries to tackle dirt, oil, and odors. The secret? Natural soaping agents called saponins. They're non-toxic and safe for our bodies, water, and planet.

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**FOR WASHING CLOTHES:** Place 4-5 soap nuts in provided muslin bag. Close bag and put in washing machine with clothes. Choose water temperature and wash. After the load is done, remove the bag and set nuts aside to dry. Or use again immediately in the next load. It's that simple! Reuse soap nuts up to 10 times. When the shell is paper thin and appears gray, it's time to replace them and compost the used nuts.

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**ALSO A MULTI-PURPOSE CLEANER:** Put a handful of soap nuts in 2 cups of hot water and boil the mixture for 10-15 minutes. Allow to cool, strain, and add liquid to an empty spray bottle. Use to clean your house from top to bottom - including windows.
